Despite the ongoing threat from COVID-19, the Holy Ghost Church in Ambridge has worked to continue the parish's spiritual life and parish activities - while taking prudent precautions to protect the health and well-being of the parish's members. Included in this effort has been the parish's outreach programs locally, on the diocesan level, and nationally. The parish's faithful continue to provide hot meals several times a year at the Center for Hope, a non-denominational Christian organization that provides programs, a food pantry, and meals to families and residents living within the Borough of Ambridge and the surrounding towns and townships that comprise the large Ambridge Area School District. Parish volunteers prepare hot meals at the parish's Youth Center facility, box them in take-out containers, and distribute those meals in the parking lot of the Center for Hope located at a former Ambridge school building. The parish also provides funds for the families of the neighborhood near the church on Maplewood Avenue to purchase school supplies materials for the children. Likewise, the parish distributes gift cards to the families of the neighborhood annually prior to Christmas so the parents can purchase additional gifts for their children at Christmas. The Holy Ghost Ladies Altar Society and the parish also continue to financially support the St. Cyril of White Lake Orthodox Food Pantry at our diocesan parish on Southside, Pittsburgh. The parish generously supports the St. Nicholas Project of the Fellowship of Orthodox Christians in America (FOCA) each November, a project that provides funding for the married seminarians of our Orthodox Church in America's seminaries to provide extra Christmas gifts for their wives and children. The parish has established a special fund to anonymously support the families of the parish suffering financial hardships due to the loss of jobs related to the pandemic and maintains its own food pantry in the church hall to provide emergency food items to our membership. In-person church school/teen group classes also resumed in October along with the monthly adult education "Sunday Dialogue" series. We also rejoice that the parish's liturgical life has returned to the pre-pandemic level.

Currently, there has been an influx of inquirers who have shifted the focus of classes to more catechetical material, which has also been appreciated by long term members. We are looking forward to another year focused on our spiritual lives and deepening our religious education.

2020 and 2021 have seen both challenges and blessings for St. Mary Orthodox Church. These two years have encountered the Covid Pandemic and extreme medical surgeries which cost Igumen Patrick his legs. Despite the adversities encountered, the Church has not stopped working or growing. The parish has lost two beloved parishioners who transferred into the Kingdom of Heaven, and has gained three families. The Church has seen the largest ever 'Get Stuffed With Love Program' with 4500+ meals prepared in house and delivered to those in need in our community by the Pittsburgh Police. The St. Cyril of White Lake Food Pantry has provided food assistance biweekly to thousands of people. The Church installed a handicapped restroom and new handrails in the rectory and handrails into the Church building. The Church has also completed the repainting of the Church building with some needed spot pointing, and has added new Icons in the Church. Igumen Patrick has continued to mend and has returned to serving. While down he has overseen needed Church projects and engaged in numerous catechetical classes, marriage counseling with new couples and outreach counseling to other amputees.

St Nicholas Church is located directly outside of downtown Pittsburgh. Our misson: *St. Nicholas Church will strive to glorify God through Orthodox Christian worship, sincere love and care for one another, and service to those in need around us.*

The following highlights summarize the parish life and accomplishments in 2021 to date:

- Liturgical Services: At the beginning of 2021, two Divine Liturgies were offered (Saturday and Sunday) for the faithful to have adequate space. We returned to our normal schedule during Holy Week of 2021. Daily Matins with Office Hours (on Tuesdays and Thursdays) began again in February 2021.
- Church Beautification: The iconography project for the entire bottom half of the church has been completed, with the addition of new icons covering the walls of the children's room and the candle kiosk. 2022 will begin the work of new iconography on the entire ceiling of the church.
- Educational Programs: Our educational programs continue with Church School for school-age students (preschool through 12th grade) in six classes. Our Vacation Church School was attended during the summer by 40 students up to Grade 8, learning about the theme of Spreading the Gospel. Bible Study is held twice a month for adults. A comprehensive catechism class is held for catechumens who are preparing to enter the Orthodox faith.
- Clergy: We were blessed to another one of our parishioners, Fr Deacon John Skowron, ordained to the Holy Diaconate by Archbishop Melchisedek in June.
- Charitable Endeavors: We host a monthly food pantry for those in need in the neighborhood. We also host a yearly Community Day, inviting our neighbors to be with us in worship and fellowship. We were also honored to spearhead a fund drive to aid Fr Patrick Carpenter which raised over \$30,000. We also give gifts through
- Homeschooling Support: We host the St Macrina Homeschooling Co-op which brings together families from across the Pittsburgh area to share in a day of learning and fellowship.
- Outreach and Evangelism: We have upgraded our video and audio equipment to livestream the Sunday Divine Liturgy in a more professional format. We are honored to be the home of four popular podcasts on Ancient Faith Radio. Fr Thomas is heard frequently on WORD-FM in Pittsburgh on "The Ride Home with John and Kathy." While we were unable to have our yearly Symposium which attracts attendees from around the tri-state area, we will continue the yearly Symposium again in 2022 on the theme of Orthodox Christian Iconography.
