This past year at the cathedral we chrismated four new converts and continue to see an increase in interest in Orthodoxy in young folks in their twenties, male and female. We are averaging about 89 people in attendance on Sunday's. We have continued to hold adult education as well as book studies at various times throughout the year. Pierogies remain as popular as ever - we make a few hundred dozen on several Saturdays during the year and donate all proceeds to various groups outside the parish, especially seminaries, seminarians, monasteries, WCN, soup kitchens, etc. We have increased our activity in Orthodox Christians for Life, holding regular monthly moliebens and continued support of and participation in Women's Choice Network. We have also been increasing our social activities with men's and women's nights at the rectory and festal celebrations, like Oktoberfest, throughout the year at coffee hour.

#### Parish Life

- Church School/Teen Group 2023-2024 academic year has begun with 23 children enrolled (K-12th Grade).
- Parish metrical records for calendar 2022 include: one new member (transfer); one Baptism; one convert; eleven funerals; one wedding // current adult census = 139.
- Parish again participated in the Ambridge Festival of Churches at the downtown borough park with a food booth and Orthodox educational materials distributed.
- Continued monthly "Sunday Dialogue" education sessions for parish teens and adults with Fr. Bill to discuss questions about the Orthodox Faith, comparative religion studies, and current moral issues.
- Periodic evening Bible Studies during the year.
- Continued outreach dinners at the non-denominational Center for Hope in downtown Ambridge + provided food bank supplies throughout the year of household and non-perishable food items to Ambridge, nearby Leet Twp., and the St. Cyril of White of Lake Orthodox Food Pantry (Pittsburgh).
- Once again held a very well received pre-Nativity children's program in the church nave.
- Provided four Orthodox camp scholarships for parish youth to attend the St. Vladimir's FOCA Camp in nearby Ohio.
- The parish's pledge system, in lieu of the outdated "dues" system, continues to grow steadily.

- Parish physical plant improvements continue in an orderly manner using a constantly updated planning cycle for the parish's four buildings (church, educational center, youth (event) center, and rectory - including a beautiful new church lawn sign installation.
- Hosted two sisters from the Holy Transfiguration Monastery (Ellwood City) for talks.
- Continued our Simply Social restaurant night-outs for parish members and guests.

# **Intercession of the Holy Virgin Church**

The parish has the following ongoing projects: upkeep of the Memorial Cross and Garden, refurbishment of the church domes, upkeep of the parish house, and a free parish library. Several successful fundraisers were held including a Christmas festival, the parish Christmas card, Kolbassi sales, Easter Chocolate cross sales, outreach to Orthodox in other states and countries, and the Sunday School assembled emergency kits and contributed money to help the earthquake victims in Turkey. Additionally, a Christmas Angel Tree helps the underprivileged and fruit baskets are sent to parishioner's homes who are hospitalized.

The parish serves services on Saturday evenings, Sunday morning, and the major feasts of the church as well as Lenten services.

A major celebration was the ordination of Deacon Nicholas York on Saturday, May 23 at the Monastery of the Holy Transfiguration in Elwood City. A banquet was held in his honor on Sunday, June 11 following the Divine Liturgy which was attended by parishioners and well-wishers.

# St. John the Baptist Church

St. John the Baptist Church continues to pursue the life in Christ as a community. In the past year we hosted a number of food festivals as both fundraisers and outreach to the local community. Members remain steadfast in their participation in the life of the divine services, with weekly Daily and Great Vespers, an ongoing bible study of Genesis, and a number of continuing catechesis groups. Additionally, we've seen an increased attendance at Certain, festal vesperal Liturgies, followed by a fellowship meal. Finally, Our choir director continuously works on strengthening the beauty of our worship, now holding monthly rehearsals.

In the last year we've seen growth in our membership as well. On Lazarus Saturday we baptized three young men in the Allegheny river. Right now we have several catechumens as well as brand new inquirers attending consistently; it seems like every Sunday we see new faces. We've also seen an increase is parish stewardship regarding meals for fellowship, cleaning of the temple, and participation in parish events like our Apple Bake-off and upcoming Chili cook off.

For ongoing instruction and community building of the faithful, we've hosted a number of guest speakers and fellowship events, including: The "A Christian Ending" retreat, co-sponsored by the diocese; two parish bowling nights; "Man of God" movie night and discussion; "An Evening with St. John Chrysostom" by Dr. David Ford; a men's night fellowship cookout; and a visit by the St. Tikhon's seminary mission choir and dean, where the faithful gave generously to support the cause of the seminary.

## St. Mary (Holy Dormition) Church

2022 - 2023 has seen many a time of growth and change here at St. Mary's Orthodox Church. Beloved church laborers Serge Daniels, Edward and Elizabeth Oleniacz fell asleep in the Lord. Seven new people were received into the Orthodox faith through Baptism and/or Chrismation. Four babies were born. The calendar year 2022 ended with a successful 'Get Stuffed With Love Thanksgiving Event with the Pittsburgh Police and Rotary Clubs with over 3500 meals served. The Food Pantry remained in regular operation serving between 40 and 60 families every two weeks. Our Liturgical Schedule has returned to normal, and efforts are underway to further expand it. Alex Carson was ordained to the subdiaconate by Archbishop Melchesidek. The parish is in preparation for its Annual Spaghetti Dinner (Nov. 4) and this year's Get Stuffed With Love Thanksgiving Program.

St Nicholas Church is located directly outside of downtown Pittsburgh. Our misson: *St. Nicholas Church will strive to glorify God through Orthodox Christian worship, sincere love and care for one another, and service to those in need around us.* The following highlights summarize parish life and some accomplishments in 2023 to date:

- Liturgical Services: We offer Saturday Cathedral Vigil and Sunday Divine Liturgies, all major and some minor feast days and the eves of feasts, daily Matins with Office Hours on Tuesdays and Thursdays, and Wednesday Vespers before Bible Study twice a month. We also hold daily services during the Great Lenten period.
- Church Beautification: The iconography project has continued with three new large murals on the ceiling of the Nativity, Resurrection, and Pentecost. The iconography project is now paused for dome work, repairing leaks in the roof.
- Capital Projects: We have contracted with an architect, Gus Kayafas, to provide possible solutions to our ongoing issue with building leaks. After a parish meeting, it was decided to move forward with engineered drawings and a bidding process for new domes for the Church.
- Educational Programs: Our educational programs continue with Church School for school-age students (preschool through 12th grade) in five classes (33 registered students). Our Vacation Church School was attended during the summer by 35 students up to Grade 8, on the theme "Wildlife Wonders: Animals in the Bible." Bible Study is held twice a month for adults. A comprehensive catechism class is held for catechumens. We held our annual St Nicholas Symposium on the subject of "Christian Iconography and the Second Commandment." Attendees from as far as Lousiville KY learned from the four speakers from a theological, philosophical, practical, and experiential perspective.
- Charitable Endeavors: We host a monthly food pantry for those in need in the neighborhood. We also host a yearly Community Day, inviting our neighbors to be with us in worship and fellowship. We are donating a portion of the proceeds of our Slavic Food Fest to benefit Ukrainian refugees in Poland. Several of our parishioners have played a leading role in organizing the planned St Constantine Classical School in Pittsburgh and our parish has participated in the fundraising activities. The new headmaster, Jesse Cone, and his family, are members of our parish.
- Outreach and Evangelism: Our Sunday Divine Liturgy is streamed on Facebook and YouTube. We are honored to be the home of four popular podcasts on Ancient Faith Radio. Fr Thomas is heard frequently on WORD-FM in Pittsburgh on "The Ride Home with John and Kathy."
